Humshaugh Vicarage

I am sat writing this feeling slightly numb and wondering at the continuing folly of humanity. The news all today has been about a coalition of Western forces bombing parts of Syria in retribution for the Assad regime's use of chemical weapons on its own citizens. Wherever you stand on the debate over the war in Syria, or the growing conflict with Russia, military action without a clear and defined political agenda is quite terrifying.

At the same time we have started lambing, birth and new life in our very hands on way. Sitting next to the lambing pens and thanking God for the safe arrivals I was struck with the paradox of the day. Missiles, bombing and death followed by newborn lambs.

But what should we make of it, what might a Christian response to this be?

I think that although we saw Jesus respond in righteous anger as he cleared the temple courts, and this has been used by many people to say that Christ was not a pacifist, I struggle to see anywhere in his life where he allowed violence to lead to more violence. In fact there is the passage about cheek-turning and coat-giving that we all know so well that speaks plainly against retaliatory violence. But what should we think, what should we do in the face of such atrocities being acted out against innocent civilians?

Perhaps the start of our response might be that we continue to call for a political and negotiated end to the violence, just because a thing seems hard doesn't mean we shouldn't try. Also, we can continue to support, in any way we can, all of the agencies that bring shelter, food and medical aid to the war zone. Next, we should never forget the lessons of history, especially about how violence has a way of escalating out of control.

Finally, and most importantly, we need to pray. To pray for peace and an end to the violence and warfare, perhaps to pray harder than we have ever prayed before.

But I want to close with a note of optimism and ask you to remember my new-born lambs that arrived the same day as the missiles in Syria. When God made us he imbued us with a spark of life that is hard to put out, we fight and kick (sometimes with all four legs) to survive and find a way through. And if we persevere, as my ewes and lambs have done, then we can and will find a way to make peace though all the fighting; and that's well worth believing in and praying for.
