Alleluia Christ is risen; he is risen indeed alleluia!

This is one of the phrases which sticks in my mind with vivid images attached of having said it or replied over the years. This is the phrase that heralds the new light of Christ as we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus very early on Easter morning. Locally we do this either at the Easter Vigil service, on Easter Eve at Birtley as the light is waning, and the church is in darkness, and the first light, lit from the fire is carried into the church. Alternatively or in addition many folk gather at Thockrington on Easter Day very early in the morning to greet the new dawn and the risen Jesus. This is a very ancient ceremony, when those who had made the decision to follow Christ would be baptised, or christened. As I write this we are in the middle of Lent, but we must not forget that we are in Lent as the time of preparation for Easter, when we think again of the signs that Jesus did as he prepared to go to Jerusalem that last time, ending with his death on the cross and then his marvellous resurrection on Easter Day. Jesus gave his all for everyone for all time.

We are being bombarded by information of every kind about the Coronavirus. Some folk will be very worried by this, and we may all end up in isolation, but we must not forget to love and care for those around us. Our lives change and evolve through the years- we get frightened, we lose people that we love, and we gain new members to our circle of family and friends. Our churches change, in how they look, in who is there and with whom we are grouped. In all the changes and chances of our world, we can be sure of one thing, of God's unfailing love for each of us, created in his image and for whom Christ died on the first Good Friday. On Easter day we can truly say: Alleluia Christ is risen: he is risen indeed, Alleluia!
