Pastoral Letter

Dear Friends.

I write this in the beautiful warm weather in the middle of September, on a day with wonderful blue skies with the autumn colours beginning to unfold, and the combine harvesters working away in the fields. It is also the day on which we in Northumberland and the surrounding area have been told that we must have much more strict rules to keep each other safe in the pandemic. Those with whom we have been accustomed to meet up for the last couple of months are now, once again, to be distant for a while. We will need to be vigilant and keep an eye on those who are alone, as the restrictions are tightened. We will need to be active in being good neighbours and in continuing to love our neighbour in practical ways. I know that many of us find the wearing of masks inconvenient, uncomfortable and at times claustrophobic, as well as a fogging hazard, especially if you wear glasses! However, there is another side to wearing masks. I am constantly reminded as I see the infinite variety of imaginative designs and colours, that they are a very visible badge of our love and care for each other. Jesus said, 'Love your neighbour as yourself' and the wearing of a mask is doing just that. It is not primarily for our own protection but for those with whom we live and move and have our being. It is so important that we each do this small thing for one another in order that the COVID virus is brought under control.

Some folk cannot wear a mask, and part of loving our neighbour is also to be understanding and not judgemental of those unable to play their part in this way. Wear your masks if you are able to as a mark of your love and care for others, as we continue to hope and pray for a vaccine and a treatment for the illness.
