

I write this on a very cold May afternoon! Looking back on last year's photos in May warmth and sunshine pervaded. Maybe that's often the way with the past we tend to have 'rose tinted specs'. I am continually struck with what a beautiful part of England we live in and how blessed we are to have our variety of seasons even when it is abnormally chilly like it is today. Phil and I have explored so many local footpaths in the past year, some of which we previously didn't know existed. Each time they are new experiences ...changing weather, different birds and flowers to encounter.

As you read this in early June, the days will have lengthened more and perhaps we will have more warmth. In our seasons of the church's calendar we will have lived through Rogation, Ascension and Pentecost culminating with Trinity Sunday. Just as we appreciate the nuances of different seasons in the world around us, each season in the liturgical calendar brings fresh experiences to revisit. Our cycle of the church's year brings periods of drought and darkness as maybe we experience though Lent and Holy Week but also periods of light and warmth and growth. We have liturgical colours of sombre purple in Advent and Lent, gold and white for the Christmas and Easter seasonal celebrations and red for the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. We now lead into green for what the church calls 'ordinary' time. Changing moods and seasons help us to relive and revitalise our faith.

While seasonal festivals focus us on specific events, ordinary time offers us readings about aspects of life that we sometimes choose to ignore, themes that help us to grow in faith and discipleship. Green is for growth. God transforms our ordinary lives when we offer them, the gifts we offer and bring, the muddle and mess of ordinary everyday living, the anxieties we hold, the fatigue that takes over us, the sadness, joy and gladness – our ordinary everyday existence becomes 'extra ordinary' with God.
