We also remember the many who have died over the last 18 months during the time of the Pandemic. In this strange last 18 months we have all become much more aware of the fragility of life, and also of how much the memories of those we have lost are precious to us.

There are Acts of Remembrance both on Remembrance Sunday and Remembrance Day in various places round the Deanery.

I am also delighted that Fr Jim and Deacon Anne and I are working more closely together to plan for the future and I am also very grateful for all who work so hard to keep our churches open and looking loved and prayed in. We have a chance to say goodbye and thank you to Bishop Christine who has served this Diocese for the last six years, on 2st November at 4.00pm at the Cathedral. We wish her and her husband Roger well as they retire again!

We hope and pray that we will be able to prepare for and celebrate Christmas in our churches this year. God Bless

## Looking on the Bright Side.

Pausing to reflect on the past many months of the horrible pandemic, it seems that it has not been all bad from a church point of view - indeed some positively good things have come about.

For instance our worshipping together on Zoom. What a technical achievement it has been that we have been able to meet together regularly each Sunday, for over 18 months. It has been such a blessing, and has enabled many people to join in who have hitherto been unable to get to church. We have come to recognise and regard as new friends those from other parishes. We have begun to think of ourselves as not only members of our own dearly loved parish churches, but as members also of the wider community of the Deanery. As the restrictions have eased and in-person services have again been permitted, a new pattern of Sunday and weekday worship has been arranged. With only one full-time stipendiary priest serving 19 parishes, with some non-stipendiary volunteer assistance, and the help of dedicated laity, we have needed to become more open-minded and adventurous in attending services. We ourselves decided that we would like to try and attend a service in each of our churches in the Deanery. As a result we have had the opportunity to admire beautiful church buildings - some which we have passed many times with no more than a cursory glance – with their interior fabric faithfully cared for during Lockdown. We have greatly enjoyed worshipping with other congregations, sometimes only a handful of welcoming folk, with maybe one or more of our new Zoom friends. It has been a real pleasure.

During these visits we have enjoyed some very special experiences and made unexpected discoveries too. For example, at Chollerton seeing the Roman capitol stone which had been unearthed that very week during the reconstruction of the wall around the churchyard; at Horsely, with its special acoustics, hearing the recently restored organ being played beautifully; at Thockrington attending the memorable Easter sunrise service; at Byrness, the most northerly parish, we admired the notable stained glass window dedicated to the many workers who died during the construction of Catcleugh reservoir – and enjoyed delicious cakes! We attended one of the rare services at the gem that is Heavenfield, and a Confirmation at Wall. Closer to home, at Simonburn we heard our rehung bells rung for the first time.

We know that others have also visited different churches, and have found it enjoyable and interesting. For our part we have felt richly rewarded by our adventuring around our widespread Deanery – and we still have several churches to go!

As we look to the future and await the appointment of a priest for the north of our Deanery, we are likely to stay with a similar pattern of worship for some time to come, with fewer services in our own churches. So do be encouraged by our experiences, to venture forth and explore other churches in the Deanery. Who knows what joys and unexpected delights may await you!
