One Big Story

Did you ever wonder what the Bible is all about? Is it just a random collection of writings from different time periods? Have you ever listened to the readings in a church and wondered how they fit together? Do you feel that you could articulate the Christian Faith clearly and succinctly to someone who asked you the question 'so what's it all about?'

Amazingly, the children in our church schools can do just that by the time they leave First School, thanks to a brilliant resource called 'Understanding Christianity.'

This teaches them that Christians believe that the Bible tells 'one Big Story' from beginning to end and that the story can be told using eight core concepts. The first four concepts appear in the Old Testament and are as follows: In the beginning was **God:** Father, Son and Holy Spirit. God created our universe, the world and everything in it including creating humans in his image and his **Creation** was good.

Then came the **Fall**, which is when humans turned away from listening to God and began to stop caring for His Creation. The relationship between God and humans was broken and sin, struggle, decay and death came into the world. God's rescue plan was to choose a special people to be the **People of God.** He promised to take care of them and they were supposed to follow God and show everyone else how to follow Him. The rest of the Old Testament tells the story of their relationship with God. Sometimes they got things right, but often they strayed from God, ignoring his commands and worshipping other Gods.

So God came up with an unexpected solution: At the start of the New Testament we learn how God comes down to earth in human form as Jesus and this is known as **Incarnation** (God in the flesh). This is what Christians celebrate at Christmas. When Jesus grew into a Man he brought the **Gospel** (Good News). This included offering friendship to all, forgiveness and peace. He also brought **Salvation** (Rescue) through his death on a cross, wiping the slate clean for all of the bad things humans have ever done, or will do, and making a way for God to forgive them. By coming back to life from death he also gave humans the hope of eternal life after death and sent the Holy Spirit as a helper to humans in this life. We are now living in the **Kingdom of God** but this is only partially realised on earth. Some people are following God but many are still not listening to Him or caring for His Creation. The Bible says that Jesus will come to earth again, and make everything new; there will be no more sadness, pain or tears.

So that's the heart of the Christian story, summarised in eight concepts. I wonder how much you already knew and which bits are surprising to you? If you come to one of our Christmas Services, this year you might want to look for references to the **'Incarnation'** in the readings and the carols? If you want to know more ask the person leading the Service to point you in the direction of more information and resources.





A NEW YEAR


