## Pastoral Letter from Chollerton Vicarage

I write this letter as we are again in lockdown, waiting and wondering what we may be doing in a few weeks time. This weekend, it is Stir up Sunday, as well as the feast of Christ the King, when we are reminded to allow ourselves to be stirred up and be prepared to be filled with hope and joy as we prepare for the coming of Christ the baby in the manger. Next weekend we begin the waiting time of Advent, and Christmas for the Christian Church does not come until Midnight on 24<sup>th</sup> December!

I was reading a meditation by Barbara Brown Taylor who writes that however different we imagine our Christmas may be from normal, a universal longing is for a calmer purer more centered life, a rising above the anxiety of the world as we know it at the moment. We receive Christmas cards with an image of the manger, the calm animals, the sleeping child, the doting and serene parents and the star. But that does not tell the whole story. It is a snapshot in a story of folk with no home and no room for a mother to give birth, so she is forced into a stable. And after the angels left? Maybe the donkey stepped on a hen and the resulting squawk woke the baby and upset Mary who did not know where the next meal would come from? Not the picture of serenity and love on the card at all! But God was still there. God the tiny baby in human form in the manger, in the mess. Peace and joy and love were also there because God is there in the best of times and even more so in the worst of times. It is God-with-us, not God-up-there! God with us in the messiness and sadness of Covid -19 and the changes to our lives, as well as God with us as we celebrate in whatever way we can at Christmas and look forward as we plan for the future in this area together.

May God-with-us bless you this Christmas tide.
